



Ohio River Rescue Team On Alert

35 volunteers are ready for the worst as the Ohio River crests in Cincinnati.

The Boone County River Rescue Team continued to be on alert late Monday night. The team covers 60 miles along the Ohio, on the river's only water ambulance. In addition to Ohio, The Boone County River Rescue team is patrolling the Licking River, several creeks and lakes, and other bodies of water. The team is made up of EMT's, divers, and rescuers.

Captain Dale Appel, of the rescue team, said flooded roadways are the number one concern as the week progresses.

"Where the river is right now, we would encourage no one to be out there for any reason," said Captain Appel. "You're looking at 3 to 4 mph currents."
